## Reflections From the Pastor...

Wishing all of you a blessed, healthy, happy New Year 2017, not just for New Year's Day, but for every day of this new year.

By the time you will get this newsletter, it will already be 2017. In thinking about the new year, I always try to make new resolutions to focus on. I came across this scripture passage in the Daily Guideposts for 2017 for January 1<sup>st</sup>.

Proverbs 16:24 (NSRV) reads: "Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body."

This sounds like a good goal for the new year - "*the kind words goal.*" To speak kind words instead of saying hurtful, insulting words to family, friends, or co-workers. Hurtful, insulting words come of our mouths so easily it seems, even in church, or at committee meetings before we even realize what we have said. Loud voices, hurtful words are not the way Jesus wants us to treat each other.

Will you join me in taking on this new challenge, the new goal for this year - "*the kind words goal?*" Let's make kind words a habit! Cut out this scripture from Proverbs 16:24 and put it at your desk, by your chair or on the refrigerator as a reminder:

**"Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body."** (Proverbs 16:24)



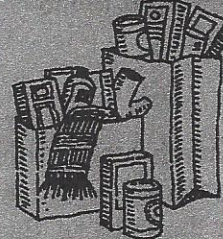
**Christian Education**

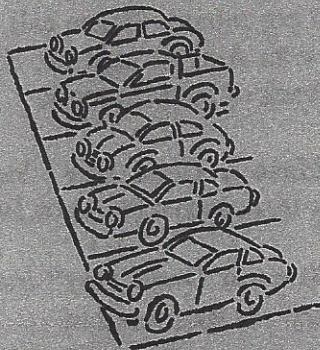

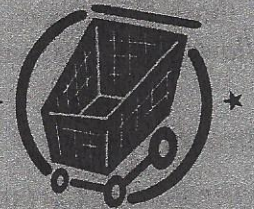
Thank you for all your support of our participation in 2016 Community Days Sales at Bon Ton. We realized a total of \$200.00.
