10. Don't hold postmortems. Don't spend your time brooding over sorrows or mistakes. Don't be the one who never gets over things.
11. Do what you can for those less fortunate than yourself.
12. Keep busy at something. A busy person never has time to be unhappy.

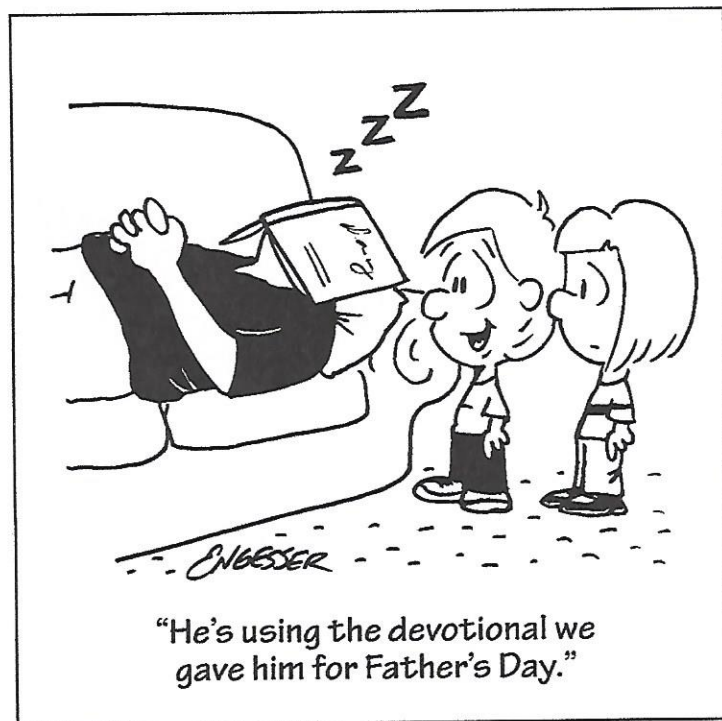

News from May (2017) meeting . . .

Boiler Heat Committee

- Boiler Heat Fund balance amount reported: \$3,506.52.
- UGI fuel bills (natural gas): **2016:** November - , December - \$1,971.87.
- **2017** January - \$2,546.01, February - \$2,457.17, March - \$1,961.58.
- Boiler heating system repair by Fritch Oil, Co. - \$2,012.
- Still looking into an estimate. Number two boiler had a leak and was repaired. However, no one knows how long this boiler will continue to function.

Hospitality Committee

- Hospitality balance as of 4/28/17: \$17,249.00
- Easter Candy profit: \$2,500.
- April hoagie sales: \$100.
- Hospitality funds paid to have the Fellowship Hall kitchen fan repaired: \$835.00

Memorial Endowment Committee

- Memorial Endowment balance - \$16,774.04.
- *Date change:* A new Revised Standard Version Pulpit Bible, 12 ½" x 10", cost: \$129.95. The Bible will be dedicated "In Memory of Faye Trobetsky", Sunday, May 21, 2017.
- Barbara Peters reported that funds (\$400 est.) have been earmarked in the Memorial Endowment fund to help cover the cost of altar flowers, when flowers are not sponsored. However, altar flowers are sponsored for nearly all worship services, making the use of silk flowers rare and payment for flowers out of the General Fund also rare.

A special note of thanks to: Pastor Lorraine M. Sell and Michael S. Sweigart, St. James UCC organist, Pastor Moises Bermudez, Pastor of Iglesia Pent. Bajo el Abrigo Del Altisimo, Pastor Fernando Gomez, Pastor of Iglesia Restauracion Unidos en Cristo, and Jeriffer Diaz, Translator, for making our first Joint Worship Service (Spanish/English) a meaningful experience. The worship service and luncheon was attended by 120 (est.) people. Joint Worship Service feedback: overall responses were positive and possibly do again, at least once a year. More volunteers needed for set-up, luncheon servers, and clean up.

Offering from our first Joint Worship Service was \$717.20 and will be forwarded to the Jubilee Breakfast Ministry. A program with Zion's Liberty Bell UCC, St. John's UCC, other UCC churches, First Presbyterian Church and many others.

- To replace a leaky heating system boiler, per Fritch Oil, Co., would cost \$13,440.00 est. To repair the leaky boiler would cost \$1,445.00. Suggestion to try the repair first, rather than replace the boiler.

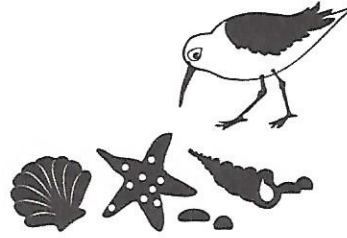
