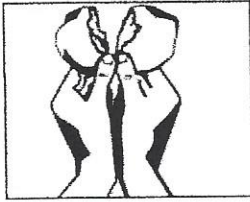

## Reflections From the Pastor...

In reading the selection for St. James UCC Book Club, “Nine Essential things I’ve Learned About Life” written by Harold S. Kushner for February 25<sup>th</sup>, some important statements put a different focus on illness and our expectations of God.

Over the 18 ½ years in ministry I have heard many peoples’ thoughts on illness, problems they may be having and God’s role in all this. I hope what I share with you now will bring you some comfort and hope for the future. These statements are written by Mr. Kushner.

1) “God does not send the problem and God does not take them away when we find the right words and rituals. God sends us strength and determination of which we did not believe ourselves capable, so that we can deal with, or live with problems that no one can make go away.”

2) “God is not the source of anguish but the source of our ability to cope with it.”

3) “God promises – I will be with you; you may feel burdened but you will feel abandoned”

4) “God does not send the problem; God send us the strength to deal with the problem.”

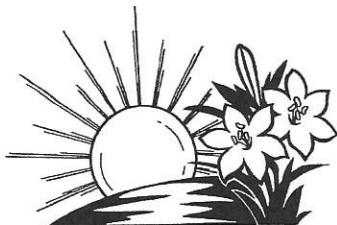
And the last one which I believe is very important and really puts a different focus on illness and healing.

5) “It isn’t God’s job to make sick people healthy. That’s the doctors job. God’s job is to make sick people brave. Prayer is not begging or bargaining. It is the act of inviting God into our lives so that, with God’s help, we will be strong enough to resist temptation and resilient enough not to be destroyed by life’s unfairness.”

And lastly, “God’s role is to give us the vision to know what we need to do, to bless us with the qualities of the soul that we will need in order to do them ourselves, no matter how hard they may be, and to accompany us on that journey.”

If your interest is peaked, get the book, there is so much more to read, soak in and be inspired by as we continue our faith pilgrimage, and our understanding of illness and God’s role. It would be a great book to read during Lent. It is available through Amazon.com.

## SEASON of LENT

The season of Lent begins with the *Ash Wednesday Service* on Wednesday, March 1, 2017 at 7:00PM.

Lent is traditionally a time for giving up something. People quit eating chocolate or drinking coffee or other things. Lent becomes a time to fast from all sorts of food and drink that are not good for your physical and spiritual health.

What if this year instead of fasting from something, we take on a new practice such as: daily prayer, daily scripture reading or devotionals, meditative walks, acts of kindness and generosity or attend the (2) mid-week Bible Study n' Lunch from 11:30AM – 1:00PM on March 15<sup>th</sup> and March 29<sup>th</sup>.

What might these forty days of taking on such a practice yield? Will you join me this Lent season taking on something new?

During Ash Wednesday service, you will have the opportunity to receive ashes on your hand or your forehead and partake of Altar Communion.

I invite you to join me Wednesday evening at 7:00PM on March 1<sup>st</sup> as we begin the sacred season of Lent.

Two other ways may also help you in your Lenten pilgrimage:

- 1.) Devotional "Moving Toward the Cross" by Martin E. Marty
- 2.) Lenten Coin Folder – a challenge of self denial to be returned during Holy Week.

This year the money will be given to the Union Terrace Elementary School for incentives for their Positive Behavior Systems.

Wonderful News!

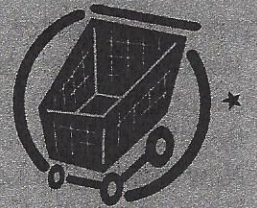
