#### **Boiler Heat Committee**

• Boiler Heat Fund balance - \$6,322.57, as of 9/12/17 Consistory meeting.

- Hospitality balance as of 9/12/17 Consistory meeting: \$15,026.28.
- Community breakfast (10/7/17) each church to provide 9 volunteers. Lynn Heinaman is St. James UCC contact/organizer. Bob Bernhard to purchase all food items and cost of breakfast food items to be split among the three congregations. St. James UCC to provide all paper goods. Bob will submit a request for food donations from Entenmann's Bakery for the breakfast. Set up for breakfast is the Friday night before.
- Bob reported that Eileen Bernhard would no longer be responsible for ordering and picking up special occasion cakes from Weis Market Bakery for Fellowship Hour, Baptisms, and new members, etc.

# Vision & Growth Committee – Next Meeting Tuesday, October 24 @10:30AM

- Fall fliers (300) distributed throughout neighborhood, with help from congregation members.
- "Make A Sundae" Sunday on schedule for Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup>. V&G committee to host
- "Blessing of the Pets", Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 10:30AM-Noon.
- Discussed "Adopt A Church" idea advertising to select musical groups with a suggestion to

consider St. James UCC as home base for practice and performance space. Consistory gave the OK to give it a try. Marie Sincavage will work on a rental specifications sheet and compile a list of feasible musical groups/organizations — to be discussed at the next V&G Committee meeting.

#### **Property Committee**

- Ongoing: estimates to fix an exterior keystone area, the source of a major water leak through one of the stained glass windows (sanctuary). Mike Sincavage and John Nyemscek met with two stonemasons, to provide proposal/estimate regarding the scope of repairs. Bid #1 \$4,130 + time and materials for the gutters and slate work on the roof. Still waiting for Bid #2.
- Bob Bernhard talked to someone about restoring hallways (1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> floors) strip old wax and wax floors. Bob suggested that we possibly do the floors ourselves. Karl Trobetsky reminded Bob that a professionally done job is done correctly and can withstand normal wear and tear for a longer period of time.
- Joni Nyemscek confirmed that the Head Start Program is not renting space at St. James UCC. Bob Bernhard reported that AA/ALANON was interested in renting space at St. James UCC for \$200 per month. Consistory did not approve the request.
- Bob reported that there was interest from another church to rent space. However, the request was for the same times as our other church rentals meet.
- Joni to ask Amy Buchanan to put to together a rental listing for space at St. James UCC – primarily Head Start area.
- There was an automobile accident in front of church Saturday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, 12:30AM.
   Damage to front concrete wall and handrails.
   Looking into deductible cost, if any, and the quickest way to repair handrails to avoid someone falling as they enter the church.

#### Vision & Growth Committee - No Report

#### **Property Committee**

- Mike Sincavage reported that Machemer Contracting, Inc. would begin work to repair an exterior keystone area within the next three weeks. The keystone area is a source of a major water leak through one of the stained glass windows (sanctuary). Total cost: \$4,130 plus an additional \$1,000 (est.) to repair the copper rain gutter & slate work, in the same area. Permit fees required by the City of Allentown (encroachment, etc.) are not included in the Machemer Contracting, Inc. proposal. Hospitality will cover the \$1,000 down payment to Machemer Contracting, Inc.
- An accident in front of the church Saturday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, 12:30AM resulted in damages to the front handrails and concrete - \$3,289. St. James UCC received two insurance checks for: \$1,179.83 and \$1,609. The deductible paid by the church was \$500. Repair work to be done by Triboro Fencing Contractors.
- Handicap ramp in front of church needs repairs/or replacement. John Nyemscek will handle repairs.




